# The Last Great Ape Organization – LAGA February 2019 Report



# <u>Highlights</u>

- 2 specialized pangolin scales traffickers arrested in Yaounde with 42kg of pangolin scales
- Legal adviser travelled to Britain for a three-month conservation training programme
- LAGA relocated to a new office

#### **General**

This month was marked by the arrest of **2 traffickers with pangolin scales.** 

The two who are specialized in pangolin scales trafficking have been running the illegal trade for several years before they were arrested in Yaounde with 42kg of pangolin scales. The pangolin scales were found inside the taxi they used for transportation and they both attempted to escape by running away when they realized police and wildlife officials were moving in on them but were quickly chased and arrested.

A legal adviser travelled to the UK to participate at a Durrell Endangered Species Management 2019 programme offered by the Durrell Conservation Academy.

The Deputy Director participated at a meeting that saw the birth of a pangolin working group in the country.

After a long search LAGA finally relocated to a new office

## **Investigations**

- **11 investigation missions** of varying lengths were carried out in **4 Regions** of Cameroon including Littoral, Center, South and East Regions.
- Good investigation in Nanga Eboko led to the arrest 2 traffickers with 42kg of pangolin scales in Yaounde.

## **Operation**

An operation carried out this month with MINFOF arresting 2 traffickers.

 19/2/2019 – 2 traffickers arrested in Yaounde, Centre Region with 42kg of pangolin scales. The two are very popular with bushmeat sellers in a notorious neighourhoud that is well known for illegal trafficking in bushmeat and other parts especially pangolin scales in Yaounde. The neighbourhood has proven over the years to be very tough to tackle, with several law enforcement attempts aborted in the area. They activated a whole network of smaller poachers and traffickers in towns especially Nanga Eboko and villages around the town.

## Legal

- LAGA Legal Department carried out **7 missions** out of Yaounde-Centre Region: 3 in Douala (Littoral) and 2 in Abong-Mbang (East), 1 in Bertoua (East) and 1 in Doume (East).
- There are **14 traffickers behind bars this month**: 8 in East region, 5 in South region and 3 in Littoral region.
- **28 cases** were followed up by the Legal Department this month.
- 22 cases were scheduled in court this month.
- **3 traffickers** were convicted this month.
- **Prosecutions**: There were one court ruling this month.
  - 01/02/2019: The Douala Bonanjo Court of First Instance found the accused HAPPY Mathias, NGHOUROUPOUO Shouiboua and TUMUYA Seidou guilty as charged and sentenced them as follows HAPPY Mathias 2 months imprisonment term; NGHOUROUPOUO Shouiboua and TUMUYA Seidou to pay 50.000 as fine each; They were also sentenced to pay 100.000.000 FCFA jointly as damages. They were arrested in Douala on the 09/11/2018 for illegal possession of 472 kg of ivory

tusks.

# <u>Media</u>

- **48 media pieces** were produced and pushed through to written press, radio, and internet including; 23 written press materials (13 in English and 10 in French), 14 radio news flashes (9 in French and 5 in English) and 10 internet publications, 8 in French and 2 in English.
- Interviewee: Tarla Francis a wildlife specialist and consultant with ZSL
- Subjects focused on wildlife law enforcement including: The Douala arrest of 4 with pangolin scales, and hippo teeth, the Doume arrest of a trafficker in pangolin scales, spotlight on world pangolin day sensitization and the Yaounde arrest of 2 over 40kg of pangolin scales.
- 27 media pieces in French and 21 in English making a percentage of 56.25% in French and 43.75% in English.

#### Presentation: Retrospections of the International Women's Day in Cameroon

As a prelude to the celebration of the 2019 International Women's (something that is always celebrated in LAGA with a time for reflection every year) one of the ladies picks up the challenge and takes us through this very popular event. She describes the day as a day set aside to bring women issues to the public and it aims at empowering women through advocating for equal opportunities. This, she continued, may be translated as access to quality childhood development for young girls, elimination of harmful practices such as forced and or early marriages, discrimination against women and elimination of all forms of violence. She normatively condemns some wayward practices and celebrations done on that day by the Cameroonian woman and highlights the huge importance of the day in emphasizing the problems faced by women. The discussions were interestingly hot with some accusing women to part of the problem and the necessity for equal opportunities and need to stop discrimination.
