Highlights

- 2 traffickers arrested with 47kg of giant pangolin scales in Nkoteng, Centre Region
- The Deputy Director and the Head of the Legal Department participated at a meeting with wildlife officials that focused on the Memorandum of Understanding to be signed with the Ministry of Wildlife and Protected Areas.

General

This month was marked by the arrest of 2 with 47kg of giant pangolin scales.

The scales are from the endangered giant pangolin. The traffickers took steps to avoid arrest and used a motorcycle to move around. They transported the pangolin scales in a bag and moved hesitantly, conscious of the risks of their illegal business.

The Deputy Director and the Head of the Legal Department participated at a meeting with wildlife officials that focused on the Memorandum of Understanding to be signed with the Ministry of Wildlife and Protected Areas.

Investigations

- 11 investigation missions were carried out in 4 Regions out of 10 of Cameroon including the Littoral, Centre, West and South.
- Good investigation in **Nkoteng** led to the arrest of **2 pangolin scales traffickers** with 47kg of giant pangolin scales in **Nkoteng**

Operation

1 operation carried out this month with MINFOF arresting 2 traffickers.

31/07/2023 – 2 traffickers arrested in Nkoteng, Centre Region with 47kg of giant pangolin scales. The scales are from the endangered giant pangolin that was poached around the Sanaga River where they collaborated to obtaining the scales. The traffickers took steps to avoid arrest and used a motorcycle to move around. They transported the pangolin scales in a bag and moved hesitantly, conscious of the risks of their illegal business.

- There are **15 traffickers behind bars this month:** 2 in East region, 2 in South region, 2 in Centre, 3 in Littoral region and 6 in West region.
- **34 cases** were followed up by the Legal Department this month.
- 28 cases were scheduled in court this month.
- **No traffickers** were convicted this month.
- **Prosecutions**: There were no court rulings this month.
