Highlights

- Deputy Director held a meeting with an INTERPOL Criminal Intelligence Officer of the Regional Bureau for Central Africa to discuss on wildlife law enforcement and strengthen collaboration.

• This month no operations took place, but the department brainstormed and came out with new strategies to ensure arrests next month.

Legal

- LAGA Legal Department carried out **10 missions** out of Yaounde Centre Region: 1 in Ebolowa (South), 1 in Sangmelima (South), 3 in Douala (Littoral), 1 in Akonolinga (Centre), 1 in Ngoumou (Centre), 1 in Bafoussam (West), 1 in Dschang (West) and 1 in Bankim (Adamawa).
- There are **17 traffickers behind bars this month:** 4 in East Region, 2 in South Region, 2 in Centre, 3 in Littoral Region and 6 in West Region.
- **42 cases** were followed up by the Legal Department.
- 37 cases were scheduled in court this month.
- 2 traffickers were convicted.
- **Prosecutions**: There was a court ruling.
 - 23/06/2022: The Yaounde Centre Administratif Court of First Instance found the accused ADAMA Mana and TCHAMGNE NDJENDE Mario guilty, and ordered them to pay 200,000 FCFA each as fines, 195,000 FCFA each as court fees and 3,000,000 FCFA jointly as damages.

They were arrested in Yaounde on the 09/06/2022 for the illegal possession of 1 lion skin and 1 leopard skin.

Media

- 33 media pieces were produced and pushed to the media including: written press, radio, and internet. That is 13 written press (9 in English language and 4 in French language), 17 radio news flashes (9 in French language, 8 in English language), and 3 internet publications (2 in French and 1 in English).
- Giving a total of 18 media pieces produced in the English language and 15 in the French making 54.5% in English, and 45.5% French.
- Subjects focused on wildlife law enforcement including: the court hearing of the case against a traditional ruler arrested with two baby chimps in Yaounde, the court case of a man arrested with a mandrill in Douala, the arrest of 4 traffickers with 90kg of pangolin scales in Akonolinga.
